RESOLUTION # 24-01-02

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURE OF ARPA FUNDS TO REPLACE DEFECTIVE COURTHOUSE WINDOWS

WHEREAS, Buffalo County received funds through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) to provide substantial infusion of resources to continue to decrease the spread of COVID-19 and bring the pandemic under control, and;

WHEREAS, Buffalo County has received \$2,527,282.00 directly from the federal government with guidelines on how the funds can be spent, and;

WHEREAS, since COVID began there has been a large number of workers leave the job market and most employers have enhanced work environments, Buffalo County has identified nine (9) defective workplace windows of which replacing them would enhance the work environment for several workers and reduce heating and cooling expenses by having windows that did not leak outside air flow and;

WHEREAS, the County Board authorized spending up to \$50,000 for a wage study in Resolution 22-10-03 and an excess of \$15,000 was left over and is being requested for workplace enhancement;

WHEREAS, the Buffalo County Finance Committee approves selecting Plitz Glass to complete this repair in the amount not to exceed \$15,000, and;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Buffalo County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the replacement of nine (9) windows not to exceed \$15,000 with the funds coming from ARPA funding excess from Resolution 23-10-03.


