Chair Dennis Bork called the meeting to order at 8:45 a.m.

Members Present: Mr. Dennis Bork, Mr. Brian Michaels, Mr. Steve Nelson and Mr. Max Weiss. Mr. William Bruegger was excused.

Others Present for All or Parts of the Meeting: Mr. Lee Engfer, Ms. Lisa Schmitt, Mr. Steve Wall, Ms. Tina Anibas, and Ms. Julie Vollmer. Ms. Leslie Sendelbach, Ms. Ashley Knudston, Sheriff Osmond, and Deputy Sheriff Jake Laehn attended virtually.

Public Comments Regarding Agenda Items: None.

Review/Discussion/Action Regarding the Previous Meeting Minutes: Mr. Weiss made a motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Mr. Nelson. Carried.

Review/Discussion Regarding Establishing Elected Official Wages for Sheriff, Clerk of Court, and Coroner: Sheriff Osmond spoke remotely regarding the proposed wages being presented for discussion today. He believes that he should be making the same or greater than what the Highway Commissioner receives and that other counties need to be looked at for comparisons.

Mr. Engfer explained that the wages were developed using the same percentile-based methodology that was applied to all employee groups. The same 20 counties that are used for all employee wage studies were used for these proposed wages as well. Mr. Engfer reported on the proposed wages to be set for the years 2027-2030. This would provide a 22.36% increase for the Sheriff and 15.8% increase for the Clerk of Court over the four-year term. The difference between the two percentages was explained and this would bring both officials in line with the same percentile as other employees.

Ms. Vollmer, Clerk of Court, spoke and gave an update on the Clerk of Court employees and work that has been done in the office. Mr. Bork stated that this information will be taken into consideration, as will what the Sheriff presented. The coroner position was also discussed, and the proposed wages were given to the committee for their information. The coroner per diem rate was also discussed and mileage is paid at the federal rate.

For all three positions, the amounts are based off the last year of comparable, established information instead of future data so the wage comparisons for all employees stay consistent. These positions were not included in the wage study previously done because of the date that was completed. All employee salaries are now based off the same 20-county comparables and the same percentile. More information will be compiled, and the wages will be set at the March meeting.

Review/Discussion/Action Regarding Risk Management and Safety Update: Mr. Wall reported that since the near-miss form was introduced he has received several reports and this is helping mitigate problems. There was an incident in the Highway Department regarding a brushing operation where a 4-6-foot-long log was ejected from the machine and struck a car. A report was filed by State Patrol, and this was filed with insurance. He stated the situation was handled well by the employees. Grants for fiscal year 2025 totaling around \$36,000 have been partially awarded, with some delayed until later this year.

Review/Discussion/Action Regarding Approval of Solid Waste Permits: Mr. Engfer explained that this is for the annual approval process for solid waste permits. Bob Fort/Green Earth Recycling is currently in litigation for not applying for a permit in 2025. The following permits should be approved for these companies who are compliant: Wm. Miller Scrap, GFL Solid Waste, Hilltopper Refuse and Recycling, Johnson Roll-off, King Scrap, Toss and Go Roll-offs, Toy's Scrap, Tri-City Sanitation, D & D Disposal/Wabasha Rubbish Removal, Waste Management/La Crosse, Jared Cyrus/Waste Transport. It is also recommended to approve the permit for Waste Management/Eau Claire pending payment being received soon as they stated a check was sent already. If not received, the permit can be suspended next month. A motion was made by Mr. Michaels to approve all solid waste permits listed above, excluding Bob Fort/Green Earth Recycling, seconded by Mr. Weiss. Carried.

Review/Discussion/Action Regarding Audit RFP Awarding: Mr. Engfer reported on the two audit firms who submitted RFPs. The companies are Baker Tilly and Clifton Larson Allen. The county has worked with Baker Tilly previously. Clifton Larson Allen (CLA) does work for 42 other counties and is familiar with Tyler Technologies. Both companies have offices in Eau Claire and are reputable companies. Discussion was held. Mr. Michaels made a motion to award the audit RFP to Clifton Larson Allen for a three-year contract, seconded by Mr. Weiss. Carried.

Review/Discussion/Action Regarding Monthly Vendor Invoices/Employment Payroll/Investment Report: Mr. Engfer answered questions regarding the reports. Mr. Weiss made a motion to approve the vouchers as presented, seconded by Mr. Nelson. Carried.

Chairperson Report: Mr. Bork asked for a ground penetrating radar update for the roads. Mr. Engfer explained we have the data and our GIS employee has converted it. Mr. Engfer is in the process of getting a license to be able to view this. This information will be discussed with the Highway Department to be used with road bans.

County Administrator Report: Mr. Engfer reported that maintenance has budgeted for heat replacement work on first floor and he has been in contact with contractors to have this work done in summer. A few areas in the annex lot are settling probably due to water main and piping issues. The City of Alma is aware of this, and it is being monitored. Sand

has been placed in the low areas. There have been problems with Bank of Alma processing our payroll. There will be a meeting with another financial institution next week.

Public Comments Unrelated to Agenda Items: None.

Adjournment: Mr. Weiss made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 10:10 a.m.

ORDINANCE # 26-03-01

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PUBLIC NUISANCE PROPERTIES

The Board of Supervisors of Buffalo County hereby ordains as follows:

A. Definitions

The following definitions apply through the entirety of this ordinance.

No person shall reside at, maintain, lease, own, rent or otherwise occupy any residence, business, dwelling or other building where any of the following nuisances are allowed to occur:

1. Such “nuisance property” has generated three or more calls for law enforcement service for nuisance activities on separate days in one month, or six or more calls in a twelve-month period. “Nuisance activities” are defined as any of the following activities, behaviors or conduct whenever engaged in by property owners, operators, tenants, occupants or persons associated with a property, whether or not a citation or arrest was made for the violation:
 - a. An act of harassment, as defined in § 947.013, Wis. Stats, as may be amended or renumbered.
 - b. Battery, substantial battery or aggravated battery, as defined in § 940.60, Wis. Stats, as may be amended or renumbered.
 - c. Indecent conduct, as defined in § 944.20(1), Wis. Stats, as may be amended or renumbered.
 - d. Prostitution or keeping a place of prostitution, as defined in § 944.30 and § 944.34, Wis. Stats, as may be amended or renumbered.
 - e. Possession, manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance or related offenses, as defined in Ch. 961, Wis. Stats, as may be amended or renumbered.

- f. Gambling or other offenses, as defined in § 945.02, Wis. Stats, as may be amended or renumbered.
 - g. Illegal discharge of a firearm, as defined in § 941.20, Wis. Stats, as may be amended or renumbered.
 - h. Any other offense that substantially annoys, injures or endangers the comfort health, repose and safety of the public.
 - i. Any other offense that greatly offends the public morals or decency.
 - j. Any other offense against public peace and orderly conduct as defined in this Code of Ordinances.
- 2. Notwithstanding Chapter 125 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as may be amended or renumbered, allowing a property or place to be used for the purpose of facilitating the consumption of alcohol beverages by underage persons.
- 3. "Person" means any individual, firm, corporation, limited liability company, society, institution, public body or any other entity.
- 4. "Sheriff" means the Buffalo County Sheriff and his/her designees.

B. General Provisions

- 1. Title. This ordinance shall be referred to as the "Buffalo County Public Nuisance Ordinance."
- 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication.
- 3. Administration. This ordinance shall be administered by the Buffalo County Sheriff.
- 4. Interpretation. The provisions of this ordinance shall be interpreted to be minimum requirements and shall be liberally construed in favor of Buffalo County and shall not be deemed a limitation or repeal of any power granted by the Wisconsin Statutes.

C. Enforcement

- 1. Notice. Whenever the Sheriff determines that there is a nuisance property as described in Subsection A of this Ordinance, the Sheriff may notify the property owner in writing. The notice shall contain the street address or legal description sufficient to identify the property, a description of the nuisance activities that have occurred at the property, a statement indicating that the potential forfeiture costs if remedial action not taken, and a notice as to the appeal rights of the owner. The notice shall be delivered via certified mail or personal service.



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2. Abatement plan. Any property owner receiving notice pursuant to this Subsection C shall meet with the Sheriff within 10 days of receipt of such notice. The parties shall review the problems occurring at the property. Within 20 days of this meeting, the property owner shall submit to the Sheriff a written abatement plan to end the nuisance activity on the property. The plan shall also specify the name, address, and telephone number of a person living within 60 miles of the property who can be contacted in the event of further police, fire, or inspection contact.
3. Additional nuisance activity. Whenever the Sheriff determines that additional nuisance activity has occurred at a premises for which notice has been issued pursuant to Subsection B, that this nuisance activity has occurred not less than 30 days after notice has been issued, and that reasonable efforts have not been made to abate the nuisance activity, the Sheriff may issue a forfeiture citation.
4. The District Attorney's office shall be authorized to prosecute any violations of this ordinance.
5. Each violation of a provision of this Ordinance shall be subject to a forfeiture not to exceed \$1,000 plus statutory costs. Each day during which the violation(s) continues shall be considered a separate offense.
6. Cash deposits, costs and assessments shall be paid to the Buffalo County Clerk of Circuit Court. The Clerk shall issue receipts for said payments.
7. The term "statutory costs" in this Ordinance includes but is not limited to the penalty assessment, jail assessment and crime laboratories and drug enforcement assessments.

D. Authority

This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authority granted by Chapters 59 and 823 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as may be amended from time to time.

E. Severability and Repeal

1. Severability - Each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word and provision of this Ordinance is severable, and if any provisions shall be held unconstitutional or

invalid for any reason, such decisions shall not affect the remainder of this ordinance nor any part thereof other than that affected by such a decision.

2. Repeal - All other ordinances or parts of ordinances of Buffalo County inconsistent or conflicting with this ordinance to the extent of the inconsistency only, are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by Section 59.09, Wisconsin Statutes.

A RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH THE TOTAL ANNUAL COMPENSATION FOR CERTAIN ELECTED OFFICIALS OF BUFFALO COUNTY FOR THE 2027 THROUGH 2030 TERMS OF OFFICE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute §59.22(1)(a), the County Board must establish the total annual compensation for elected county officials before the earliest time for filing nomination papers for said offices;

WHEREAS, the Human Resources Committee and the Buffalo County Board of Supervisors desire to set the total annual compensation for county elected officials, separate and distinct from fringe benefits, which may be increased or decreased during an officer's term in accordance with applicable law; and,

WHEREAS, as part of Buffalo County's fringe benefit program, elected officials shall participate in the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) in accordance with Wisconsin law; and,

WHEREAS, county elected officials may elect to participate in the Buffalo County health insurance program under the same terms and conditions as those applied to non-represented managerial employees who are not law enforcement managerial employees or employees described under Wis. Stat. §111.70(1)(mm)2; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Buffalo County Board of Supervisors hereby establishes the following total annual compensation for the listed elected county officials, effective on the first day of each term of office beginning after adoption of this resolution and applicable for the 2027–2030 terms, as required by Wis. Stat. §59.22(1):

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the aforementioned elected officials may participate in the county health insurance program subject to the same terms, conditions, and future modifications applicable to non-represented managerial employees who are not law enforcement managerial employees or those described in Wis. Stat. §111.70(1)(mm)2.
