Meeting called to order at 12:03 p.m.

Public Comments regarding Agenda items: None.

Review/Discussion/Action ~ Minutes of September 16, 2025: Ms. Campbell Wood accepted the motion to approve minutes as presented, seconded by Ms. Scholl. Motion carried.

Review/Discussion/Action ~ Update and recent history of the use of Trempealeau Jail ~ Mr. Brooks – Ms. Scholl stated the use of the Trempealeau Jail was originally a temporary plan to get through the Buffalo County staffing crisis. The Buffalo County Board requested jail staff to look at this situation on a more long term approach. The Buffalo County Board will review the contract anytime throughout the year to see if this plan is sustainable. Housing inmates in Trempealeau County Jail is going to be a better financial solution than building a new jail. Currently Buffalo County jail holds inmates who are pending a bail bond hearing. Once inmates have attended their bail bond hearing and they are still in jail they will be transported to the Trempealeau County Jail. This is a pilot program. Looking at 3 year program. Buffalo County jail will not be housing inmates. Judge Clark stated because of staffing issues and difficulty meeting jail inspection standards it is important for the Buffalo County Jail to remain open. Ms. Scholl stated the jail is old but in good shape. It was built in 1988 for that inmate population. Things are much different in 2025. The jail needs to meet criteria for housing and classification from low to maximum, huber, electronic monitoring, male/female, co-defendants, previous incarceration history/charge, etc. Buffalo County Jail is a 28 bed facility and is not capable nor practical to house the population we have today. Mr. Brooks inquired why Buffalo County Jail stopped utilizing the Pepin County Jail and wanted to know how Pepin County personnel felt about this move. Ms. Scholl stated Buffalo County personnel did approach Pepin County proposing a joint jail project to house both county inmates. She stated Pepin County Jail has a much lower population and they have the space to deal with their population but does not have space for Buffalo County inmates. There was no movement on the joint project. Mr. Brooks wanted to know if there was an analysis done

regarding the cost to remodel the jail compared to the cost of traveling 50 miles at \$50/day per inmate. He wants to see cost projections of the money it will cost to house inmates in Trempealeau County Jail and the money it would take to improve Buffalo County Jail. Ms. Scholl stated a feasibility study was going to cost \$20,000 that is when Buffalo County approached Pepin County regarding a joint jail, but there was no movement from Pepin County. Ms. Scholl clarified that the Buffalo County Jail uses part time staff or off duty officers to transport inmates from Buffalo County to Trempealeau County Jail and if there are no officers available they use Tallen Transport out of LaCrosse. They do not use any on duty officers for transport. Ms. Scholl clarified only one person transports inmates not two. Mr. Brooks rephrased his question regarding costs wanting to know what would we spend more money on using Trempealeau County Jail compared to cost of trying to do improvements to the jail. He asked how much effort was made with Pepin County Jail and why was the CJCC Committee was not informed about this transition. To date he has received no information of cost projections and possibility of how many hours lost where officers having to cover the transport. Ms. Scholl responded that it is early in the process so difficult to evaluate what the costs are going to be. Over the last 6 years the average cost to house inmates per year is \$325,000 x 10 years which is cheaper than building a 60 million facility. Buffalo County Board does not have the funds to support building a new jail. Buffalo County Jail is following the direction set by the Buffalo County Board. Board members see this plan as sustainable and cost effective and can see this as a long-term solution. Mr. Brooks hopes the Buffalo County Board does a cost projection. Judge Clark stated this decision was based on Buffalo County Board and he understands Mr. Brooks position and encouraged him to share his concerns with Buffalo County Board Members, Sheriff Osmond, Finance Committee or Law Enforcement Committee. Ms. Scholl reiterated the Buffalo County Board will annually review this project and there is a clause to review when someone requests. They need time to see if project is sustainable. Mr. Wicktor inquired if Buffalo County could be forced to build a new jail. Ms. Scholl stated if the facility starts to deteriorate it is possible it could be closed and not functioning. There is no state statute for a county to have a jail but requires to have inmates. Buffalo County has to have a jail to hold inmates and as long as Trempealeau County Jail can hold Buffalo County inmates we don't need to build a new facility.

In December there were 6 programs offered to CJS participants and inmates in Buffalo County, Pepin County and Trempealeau County Jails. There were a few less classes offered due to the holidays. She shared a couple of big things (1) Trempealeau County Jail and inmates being housed there are interested in continuing with the courses offered through the Moving Forward Program. All courses will be offered to any inmate interested. Inmates are thankful for the classes and view it as a wonderful opportunity to learn. Michael Turner, Recovery Coach was approved to meet with inmates individually and/or virtually in Trempealeau County Jail although this process has not started yet. Funding to support the recovery coach position has been established and that runs from 9/1/25 – 8/31/26. (2) Grant funding expires 12/31/25. Ms. Campbell Wood reached out to the individuals that oversee the grant and explained the situation of merging with Trempealeau County Jail and requested

to get back the \$25,000 that she had to return to the grant because Buffalo County Jail did not participate with the Moving Forward Program. She asked to move the deadline date to spend grants funds be extended to 12/31/25. This request was approved. Ms. Campbell Wood needs to fill out forms and provide details.

- f) CJS Data – Ms. Bautch – Report attached. Ms. Bautch reviewed. Judge Clark inquired what charges are being referred to CJS Pre-charge Diversion Program. Ms. Batch informed the committee mostly seeing possession for THC, drug paraphernalia and underage drinking.

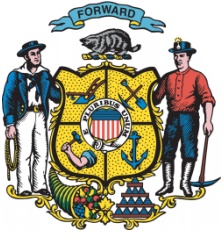

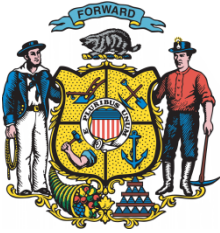

Dr. Nate Stepp is now seeing patients who are struggling with opioid use. Suboxone/buprenorphine reduces cravings and withdrawal symptoms from heroin, oxycodone, fentanyl and other opioids to help individuals get back to living a normal life. Call Emplify Health by Gunderson, Whitehall at 715-538-4361. No referral needed just call and ask for Dr. Stepp's clinic. Individuals can also call Emplify in Mondovi and ask about Dr. Stepp's clinic and get routed in the right direction.

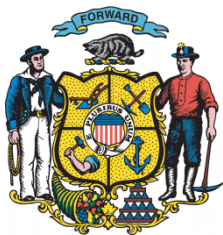

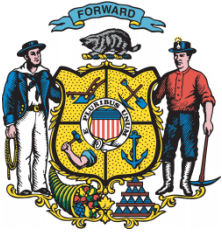

MOVING FORWARD Reentry Program Report

December 2025-January 2026

This is a brief report, and I hope to have 2025 summary report to share in February.

Trempealeau County Jail

- programming has begun by offering one class for men and women each month. They are working toward filling a program director position and will increase participation in the full offerings of the MOVING FORWARD Program at that time. Participation has been particularly good, and we are working through any glitches very well.
- They have not yet gotten going with the Recovery Coach yet. I hope that this goes by very soon.

Grant Funding Extension

- I filled out and submitted the necessary forms and justification for a request to extend the Wisconsin Idea grant funding through December 31, 2026. I have not received formal approval yet, but in an interview was assured that it would be approved, based on the information that I shared.

Recovery Coach is not being utilized, which means he is getting paid and not servicing any Buffalo/Trempealeau County participants yet. Trempealeau has not gotten up to speed on this. Also, at last check in December, he had not been going to Pepin Jail. Only meeting with some long-term recoverees in the community setting. I encouraged him to contact the PC Jail for new participants. This is not acceptable. I plan to discuss this with the Trempealeau County Jail partner. I was assured in August that they would support recovery coaching services, and it has not yet happened.

Classes and participation – December and January

Note that many of these teleconference classes are also offered in Jackson and Dunn County jails, but I am not including them on the grid below.

I would also like to note that Carissa Bollinger from the CJS office has been promoting the classes, and we are seeing increasing participation. This is very welcome!

I also offered a class entitled *The Gift of Forgiveness* to Pepin, Buffalo/Trempealeau, Dunn, Jackson, Clark, Rusk, Sawyer, and Ashland County jails, for **43 total participants**.

As you see on the grid below, a total of 9 classes were offered in addition to *The Gift of Forgiveness*, with a total of **41** participants. Classes range from one to twelve sessions. A total of **84** participants were reached with educational programs in December-January.

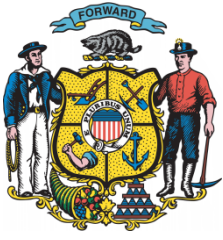

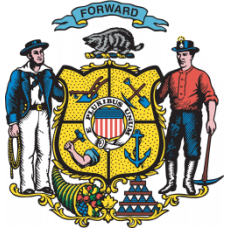

Summary

There were 25 classes offered in the first quarter of 2026 and a total of 70 participants, as shown on the table above. The classes range from one-time presentations (Salvation Army and Guest Speaker) to 12 or 14 90-minute sessions. Nearly all the programs were also made available to the Dunn and Jackson county jails but they are not included in the total number of participants here. Classes were taught by Heather Pyka, Dunn County Jail Program Director or Mary Campbell Wood. Participant educational materials provided through grant funding.

OVERVIEW

Reentry Grant Funding Status

I have now received written confirmation of formal approval that my justification and request to extend the Wisconsin Idea grant funding one more year, through December 31, 2026. This will provide approximately \$30,000 in 2026 to support the MOVING FORWARD Reentry Program.

Educational Programs

Monthly educational programs continue to be offered in Pepin, Buffalo/Trempealeau, Dunn and Jackson counties on a variety of topics that support recovery, addiction and criminal thinking and behaviors, mental health, parenting, positive communication and relationships, healing from loss, grief and trauma, etc. (see above table).

We have not yet developed any vocational or other life-skills types of classes, in part because this is not shown to be a strong criminogenic need/recidivism influencer (see graph below) and because of the slim possibilities of uptake at this time, given Buffalo/Trempealeau constraints and that [Project Proven](#) is offered through the Western WI Technical Institute and now available to Buffalo County inmates housed in the Trempealeau County Jail.

- **Pepin County Jail** - Teleconference classes and face-to-face programs continue as usual, with good support. Planning to meet with Laura, the new Jail Lieutenant and others to review and refresh the MOVING FORWARD Reentry Program design and materials.
- **Buffalo/Trempealeau County Jail** – Teleconference classes began in September 2025 and is limited by the jail administration, due to lack of staff capacity, to offering one class for men and women each month. The jail is working toward filling a program director position and will increase participation in the full offerings of the MOVING FORWARD Program at that time. Participation in the classes has been very good and we continue to work through any glitches that arise.

AmeriCorps Recovery Coach is not being utilized in the Trempealeau County Jail, which means he is getting paid and not serving any Buffalo/Trempealeau County participants yet. He is serving “recoveree” participants in the Pepin County Jail and some longer-term participants post-release and d in the community.

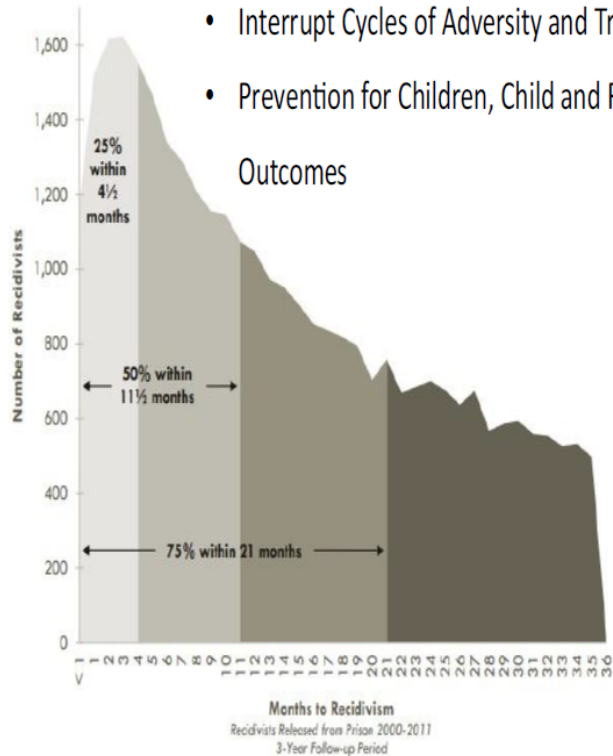
