Meeting called order at 12:01 p.m.

Public Comments regarding Agenda items: None.

Review/Discussion/Action ~ Minutes of November 19, 2025, and January 20, 2026: Mr. Hoch accepted the motion to approve November minutes as presented, seconded by Ms. Koenigs. Motion carried. Mr. Hadley accepted the motion to approve January minutes as presented, seconded by Ms. Koenigs.

Review/Discussion/Action ~ Elect CJCC Officers for one year term: Mr. Hadley accepted the motion to fill the CJCC Officers for a one-year term as listed below, seconded by Ms. Koenigs. No opposition.

- a. Chair – Judge Clark (fill in until position filled) – as of 1/1/27 Judge Clark will be retiring and will stay as Chair until then.
- b. Vice Chair – Craig Brooks – declined – calling slate absent.
- c. Secretary – CJS Staff
- d. Treasurer – Gina Rieck

Review/Discussion/Action ~ Moving Forward – Recovery Coach meeting inmates in Trempealeau County Jail ~ Ms. Mary Campbell: Ms. Mary Campbell reported that the recovery coach is still not meeting with inmates at the Trempealeau County Jail. She has contacted jail administration twice to request a meeting to discuss this issue. Additionally, she met with Ms. Renchin (recovery coach supervisor) and Mr. Turner (the recovery coach) regarding the situation. Ms. Campbell noted that \$8,500 in grant funding is allocated based on the recovery coach's ability to meet with inmates—both in person and virtually—at the Trempealeau County Jail; however, these services are still not being provided.

She is currently awaiting a response regarding a meeting date and has also discussed the matter with Ms. Scholl. Currently, there is no update on Mr. Turner's access to the jail, which continues to be a barrier. Trempealeau County is in the process of hiring a Program Director, but priority is being given to filling an open correctional officer position, which may be contributing to ongoing staffing challenges. Judge Clark stated if he or CJS staff can do anything to help we are willing to lend a hand.

Review/Discussion ~

- a) CJCC Financial Update ~ Ms. Rieck - Report attached – no change
- b) Community Service Program Statistics ~ Ms. Rieck. Report attached – numbers continue to be low
- c) Buffalo Jail Report ~ Ms. Scholl. Report attached – Ms. Scholl provided the Buffalo County Jail report (attached). She noted that the majority of Buffalo County inmates are currently being housed in the Trempealeau County Jail, with one inmate housed in the Crawford County Jail and one in the Pepin County Jail. She reported that transports are on the rise as more inmates are requesting to appear in court “in person”. However, there was a dip in transports observed in February 2026.
- d) Pepin Jail Report ~ Ms. Lora Feuling. Report attached. Ms. Lora Feuling provided the Pepin County Jail report (attached). She reported a total of nine inmates currently in custody, with three inmates utilizing recovery coach services.
- e) Moving Forward Reentry Program Update ~ Ms. Mary Campbell Wood. Report attached. Ms. Campbell Wood reported receiving accounting figures from the Office of Financial Services for the grant and obtained approval to request additional funding—just under \$35,000—to extend the Moving Forward program through December 2026. She has been in communication with Ms. Lora Feuling at the Pepin County Jail and plans to meet soon to refresh and reestablish the Reentry Program. Ms. Campbell Wood also spoke with Mr. Matt Roesler regarding Motivational Interviewing training for Human Services and other staff and is working to coordinate both the training and associated funding. A meeting is scheduled for today at 1:00 p.m. to review potential training opportunities for schools and across counties. Discussion will include the Youth Assessment and Screening Instrument (YASI), which assesses a youth's risk to reoffend, as well as their needs, responsibilities, and strengths. The tool is research-based and designed to support informed decision-making during the juvenile intake process and identify appropriate interventions for youth. The Teen Court Coordinator for Pepin County has also been invited to attend to support implementation efforts. The initiative aims to help law enforcement better understand the services Human Services can provide to youth in the community who are engaging in delinquent behavior. This concept originated with Ms. Raggin Pepin County Human Services Social Service Manager, who suggested training select law enforcement officers on the use and benefits of the YASI tool to help guide disposition recommendations and decisions regarding adjudication. Grant funding through Ms. Mary Campbell may be used to support training and implementation. Five training sessions are being offered in April. Ms. Campbell Wood noted that a full 2025 report is not yet available due to health concerns. However, preliminary data indicates that 61 classes were offered in 2025,

with 191 participants. Participation is slightly down, likely due to inmate transfers between facilities.

f) CJS Data – Ms. Bautch – Report attached. Ms. Mary Campbell Wood inquired about the success rate of the CJS Program. Ms. Bautch responded that the program continues to demonstrate a strong success rate. Judge Clark also inquired about the program's financial status. Ms. Bautch confirmed that the CJS Program is currently in a stable financial position.

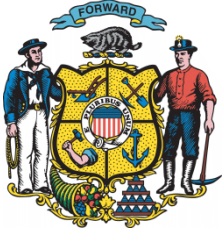

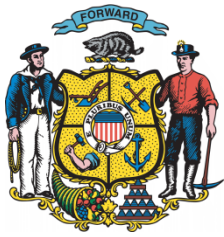

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OVERVIEW

Reentry Grant Funding Status

I have now received written confirmation of formal approval that my justification and request to extend the Wisconsin Idea grant funding one more year, through December 31, 2026. This will provide approximately \$30,000 in 2026 to support the MOVING FORWARD Reentry Program.

Educational Programs

Monthly educational programs continue to be offered in Pepin, Buffalo/Trempealeau, Dunn and Jackson counties on a variety of topics that support recovery, addiction and criminal thinking and behaviors, mental health, parenting, positive communication and relationships, healing from loss, grief and trauma, etc. (see above table).

We have not yet developed any vocational or other life-skills types of classes, in part because this is not shown to be a strong criminogenic need/recidivism influencer (see graph below) and because of the slim possibilities of uptake at this time, given Buffalo/Trempealeau constraints and that [Project Proven](#) is offered through the Western WI Technical Institute and now available to Buffalo County inmates housed in the Trempealeau County Jail.

- **Pepin County Jail** - Teleconference classes and face-to-face programs continue as usual, with good support. Planning to meet with Laura, the new Jail Lieutenant and others to review and refresh the MOVING FORWARD Reentry Program design and materials.
- **Buffalo/Trempealeau County Jail** – Teleconference classes began in September 2025 and is limited by the jail administration, due to lack of staff capacity, to offering one class for men and women each month. The jail is working toward filling a program director position and will increase participation in the full offerings of the MOVING FORWARD Program at that time. Participation in the classes has been very good and we continue to work through any glitches that arise.

AmeriCorps Recovery Coach is not being utilized in the Trempealeau County Jail, which means he is getting paid and not serving any Buffalo/Trempealeau County participants yet. He is serving “recoveree” participants in the Pepin County Jail and some longer-term participants post-release and d in the community.

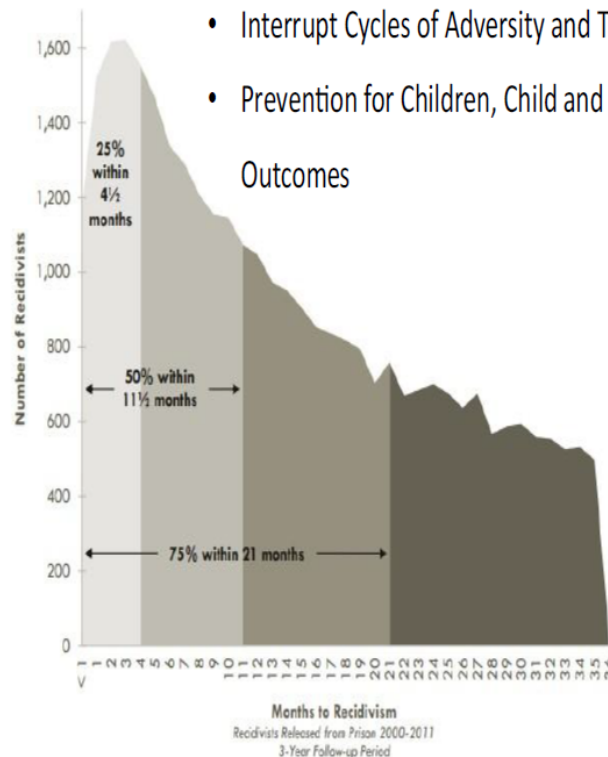

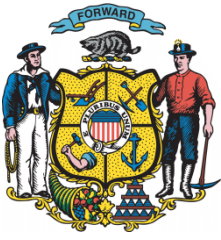
