

An Ordinance For Orderly Conduct

CHAPTER 1

AN ORDINANCE FOR ORDERLY CONDUCT

The County Board of Supervisors for the County of Buffalo do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.

STATE ORDERLY CONDUCT

LAWS ADOPTED

The statutory provisions describing and defining regulations with respect to orderly conduct and drunkenness in Sections 947.01 and 947.03 of the Wisconsin Statutes, exclusive of any provisions therein relating to penalties to be imposed or the punishment for violation of said statutes, are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this ordinance as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this ordinance, to-wit:

SECTION 2.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

(947.01)

Whoever does any of the following is in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance:

(1) In a public or private place, engages in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which such conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance; or

(2) With intent to annoy another, make a telephone call, whether or not conversation en-

IN ADDITION to the foregoing adopted state statute the following subsection (3) is added thereto with the same force and effect, to-wit:

(3) Operates a motor vehicle with the County of Buffalo so as to cause or to be made any loud disturbing or unnecessary noise, such as may tend to annoy or disturb another.

SECTION 3.

DRUNKENNESS (947.03)

Whoever does any of the following is in violation of the provisions of this ordinance:

(1) Is so intoxicated that he is unable to care for his own safety and is found in a public place in such condition; or

SECTION 4.

(2) Is an habitual drunkard and who is so intoxicated that he is unable to care for his own safety and is found in a public place in such condition shall be deemed to be in greater violation of this Section.

PENALTIES

(a) Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not more than One hundred and 00/100 (\$100.00) Dollars together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of the forfeiture and costs of prosecution shall be imprisoned in the county jail until said forfeiture and costs are paid, but not exceeding 6 months.

(b) The provisions of Section 346.16 of the Wisconsin Statutes shall apply to adjudication of violation of any provisions of this

SECTION 5.

CITATION OF VIOLATIONS

All provisions of this ordinance which are adopted and made a part of this ordinance, by reference from the Wisconsin Statutes, shall be cited as Section C followed by the number of the statute to which it corresponds and subsection (3) of Section 1 shall be referred to as C947.01 (3).

SECTION 6.

REFERENCES TO STATUTES

The term "Wisconsin Statutes" wherever used in the ordinance shall mean the Wisconsin Statutes of 1963.

SECTION 4.

REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES

All ordinances regulating orderly conduct and drunkenness in the County of Buffalo, Wisconsin, Buffalo County, Wisconsin, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance heretofore enacted by the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Buffalo, Wisconsin, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7.

SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors would have passed the other provisions of this ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid and if any provisions of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid; the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 8.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication. Adopted by Buffalo County Board on 24th day of September, 1965.
